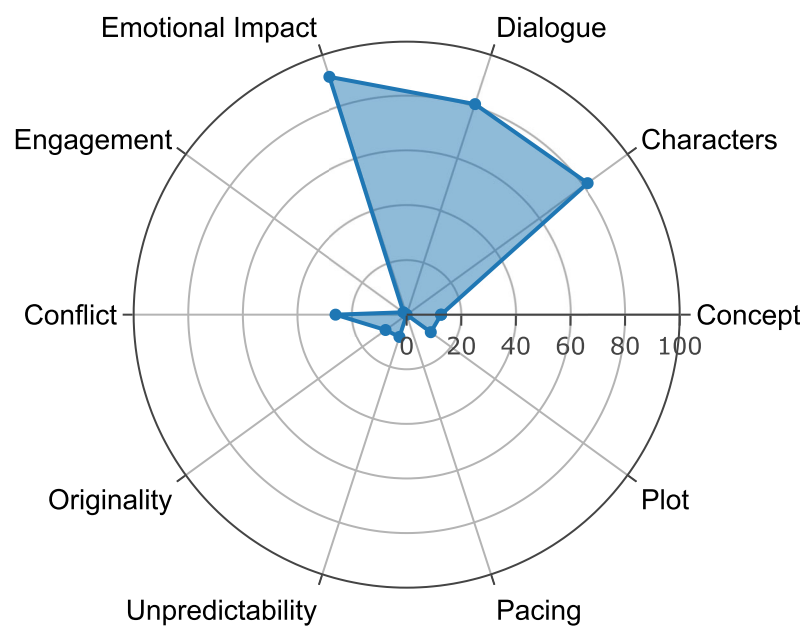

Scene Level Percentiles

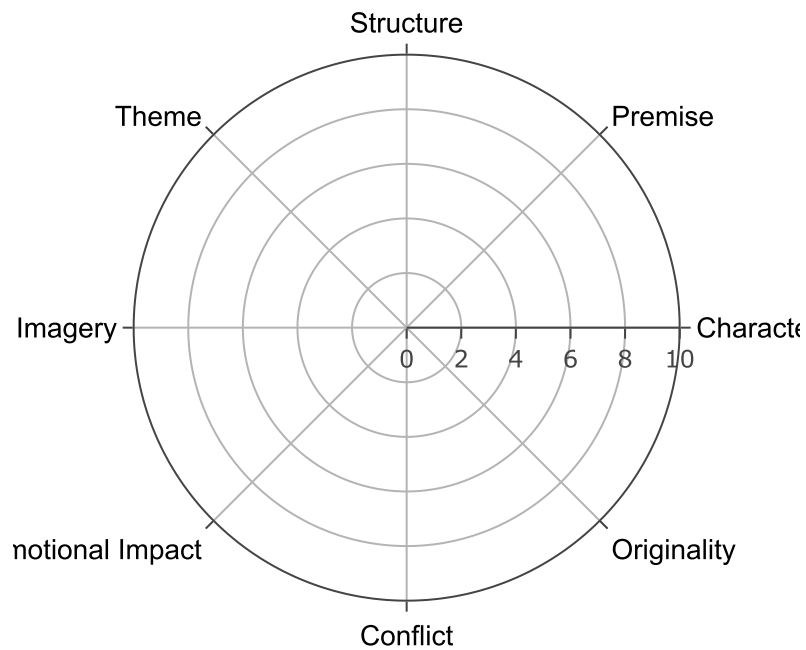

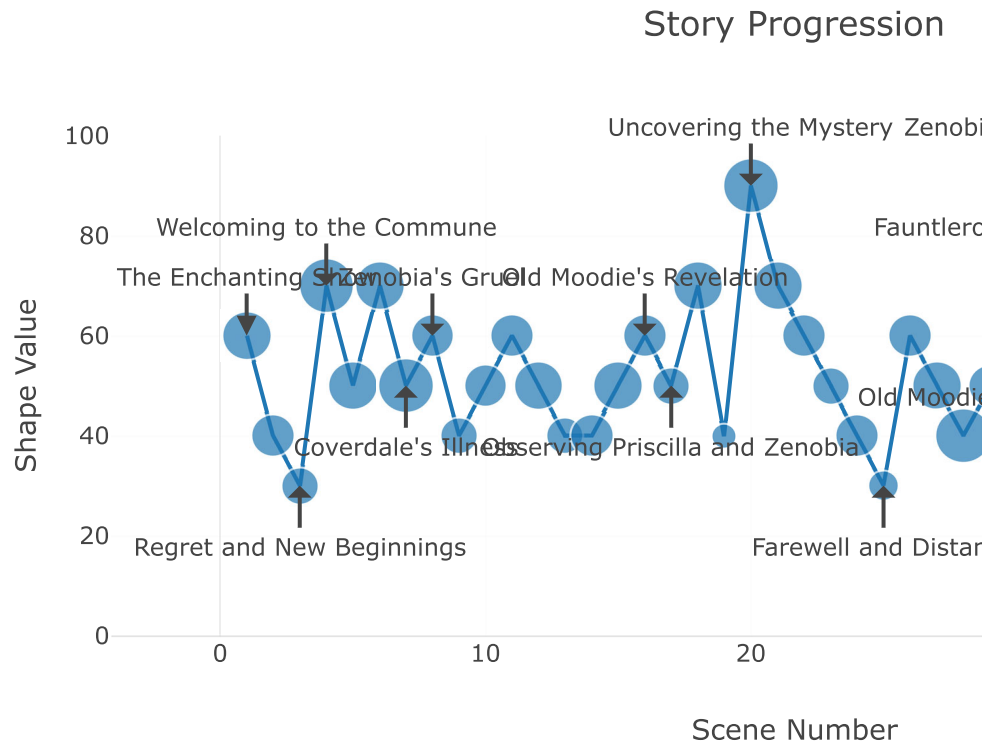
